This year, NDIA partnered with Vantage to help bridge the digital divide, providing access to digital devices and technical training to older job seekers through the Workforce Solutions program.

# PROGRAM UPDATES

## WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS

The Senior Community Service Employment Program provides paid job training to income eligible older adults who are trying to re-enter the workforce. Each year, over 700 adults age 55 and older facing barriers to employment work on a career pathway towards their professional goals.



In 2021, the SCSEP program continued at-home training packets until the State of Ohio advised return to in-person workplaces in July. Job Seekers continued to build skills at their Training Sites towards the goal of obtaining unsubsidized employment.

The digital divide has always disproportionately impacted older, low-income job seekers. Vantage Aging was awarded a grant from Department of Labor through Ohio Department of Aging to implement a demonstration program to shrink this divide. In addition to equipping Job Seekers with computers and internet, Vantage Aging's Digital Navigators coach the Job Seekers through a series of skills-tested training modules. Job Seeker competency in the new skills is evidenced by certifications earned and confidence gained. We look forward to making this program available to an increasing audience in the coming year.



## MEALS ON WHEELS OF NORTHEAST OHIO

Summit, Stark, and Wayne Counties. More than meals, MOWNEO helps seniors maintain their independence. We continue to provide a friendly visit and a daily security check. Our volunteers and donors showered us with support and the ability to fulfill our mission. This year, MOWNEO served over 382,000 meals to homebound seniors. Although we continue to face the challenges of the pandemic, we continued services with increased safety measures and community support.

## AMERICORPS SENIORS RSVP

During 2021, Vantage's AmeriCorps Seniors Retired and Senior Volunteer Program has seen an increase in volunteer engagement, recruitment, and has formed many new community partnerships. Through the new community partnerships, RSVP has been able to provide seniors with over 120 meaningful and impactful ways to connect, engage, and give back to their communities.



## HOME WELLNESS SOLUTIONS

Home Wellness Solutions helps seniors living at home age with dignity and independence. Small, nonmedical supports, such as personal care and light housekeeping, prevent seniors from prematurely leaving home for a facility. Throughout the COVID-19 crisis, we've continued to provide the only free in-home support service in Summit County.

# MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

As the pandemic continued throughout 2021, it became apparent that our agency needed to focus on the stabilization of our services, clients and finances to minimize the constant uncertainty that was present in our daily lives. I am proud that our staff embraced this theme of stabilization as they continued to further our mission of "promoting a positive perspective on aging." A few highlights from our year include:

Our Senior Community Service Employment Program provided remote training opportunities to our job seekers until they were able to safely return to their host sites. In addition, we successfully implemented our new Digital Inclusion initiative which provided seniors with the confidence to learn, navigate and leverage technology to enhance connections to their families and the community and minimize feelings of isolation.

Our AmeriCorps Seniors Retired & Senior Volunteer Program cultivated and enhanced partnerships with our volunteer stations and created new volunteer opportunities that could be done remotely without being in direct contact with others.

Our Meals on Wheels Program provided nutritious meals and a safety check to our vulnerable clients and continued to streamline and incorporate agility into its daily operations.

Our Home Wellness Program provided excellent direct personal care and chore services to our clients which allowed them to remain in their homes where they continued to feel safe and comfortable.

All of our programs would not have achieved such success without the dedicated support and expertise of our Finance, IT, HR and Community Engagement teams.

In closing, our agency's significant impact would not have been possible without you – our volunteers, donors, partners and community supporters. Thank you for your unwavering support and helping us to achieve a sense of normalcy and stability during these unprecedented times.

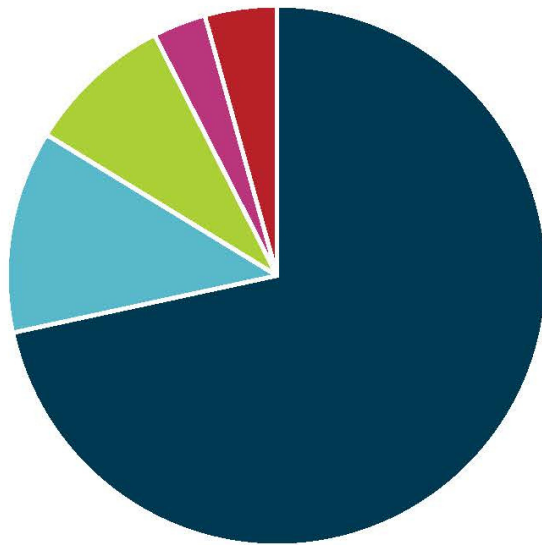

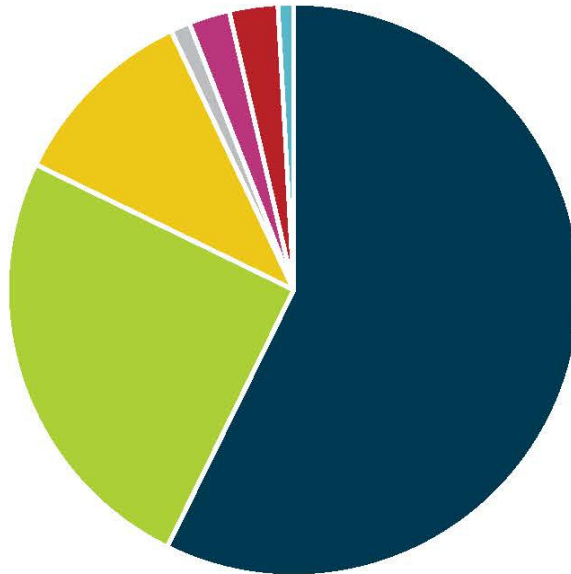
